Below are a few common mistakes that are so often made by parents that seem trivial, but can totally ruin a party.

The Don'ts

<u>Balloons</u> - NEVER scatter balloons over the floor! Why? The main reason is, this makes the children become disruptive. Causing them to start hitting each other with them and also pop them. This puts the children in totally the wrong frame of mind, as well as making them hyper and also upsets any nervous or younger children in the room. This is said through experience, by all means put balloons around the walls for decoration.

<u>Party Blowers & Poppers</u> - We would recommend never giving out party popper to children as they are extremely dangerous. As for party blowers these can be very noisy and can distract children during the entertainment.

Noisy Parents - Parents that stay often view it as a chance to have a social get together with their friends, so please watch the noise levels. We wouldn't want your child and their friends to miss the full benefit of the performance on what is essentially their one special day of the year!

There are some things when putting on a party that can make or break the event. Below 'Krazy Kev' who has been a full time children's entertainer for many years with thousands of shows under his belt, has put together this guide the help your party run as smoothly as possible.

The Do's

The Venue - Put balloons on the door or gate so your guest can find you. It's also a good idea to put a postcode on your invites as most parents use Sat Nav's these days.

Parking - Please make sure that there is a parking space made available next to the venue or outside your home for Krazy Kev's long van. As he will need to unload equipment and props and more than likely will be coming to you straight from another party, so timing is crucial and this could delay the start of the show if he has to search the neighbourhood for a parking space.

<u>Parents Contact Numbers</u> - Always get parents to leave their contact number if leaving their child as well as any dietary requirements.

Party Check List

	The Cake Including a knife, matches to light the candles and extra serviettes to wrap cake in if taking home.
	Mobile Phone In case of emergencies, but don't forget to have it turned on and near you as parents may need to contact you. It's also handy to have a pen and paper so parents that are not staying can leave their contact number.
	<u>Camera</u> Don't forget to charge or have replacement batteries.
	<u>Kitchen Roll & Cloths</u> In case of accidental spillages.
	<u>Wet Wipes</u> For sticky hands and faces.
	Party Bags For handing out at the end of the party, plus a few extra for any siblings who may stay unexpectedly.
	<u>Bin Bags</u> For all the rubbish.
